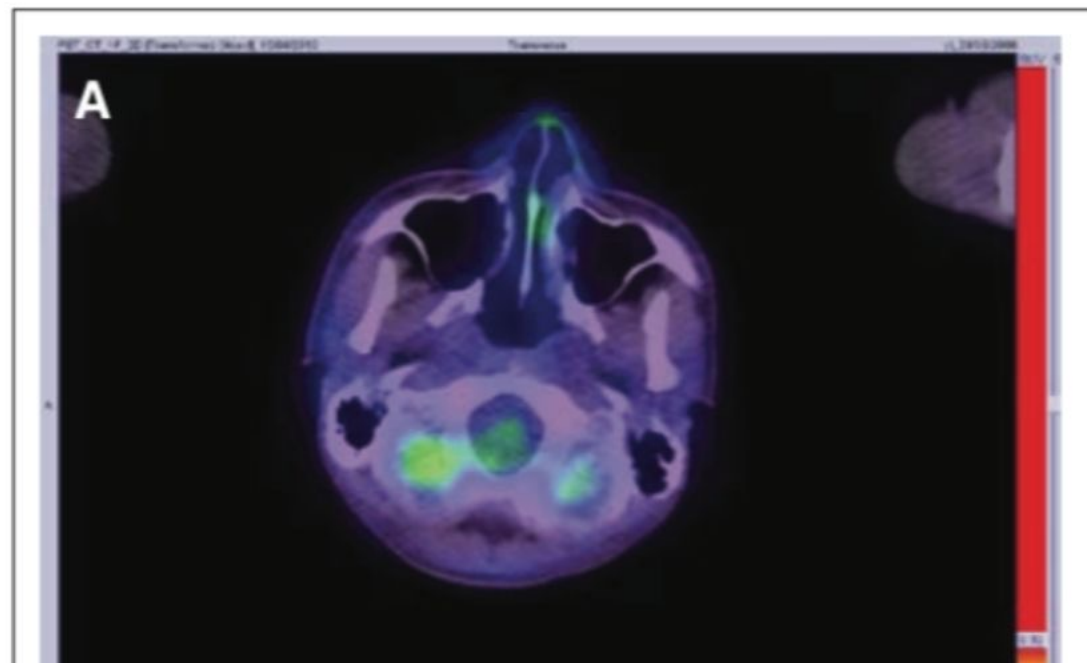
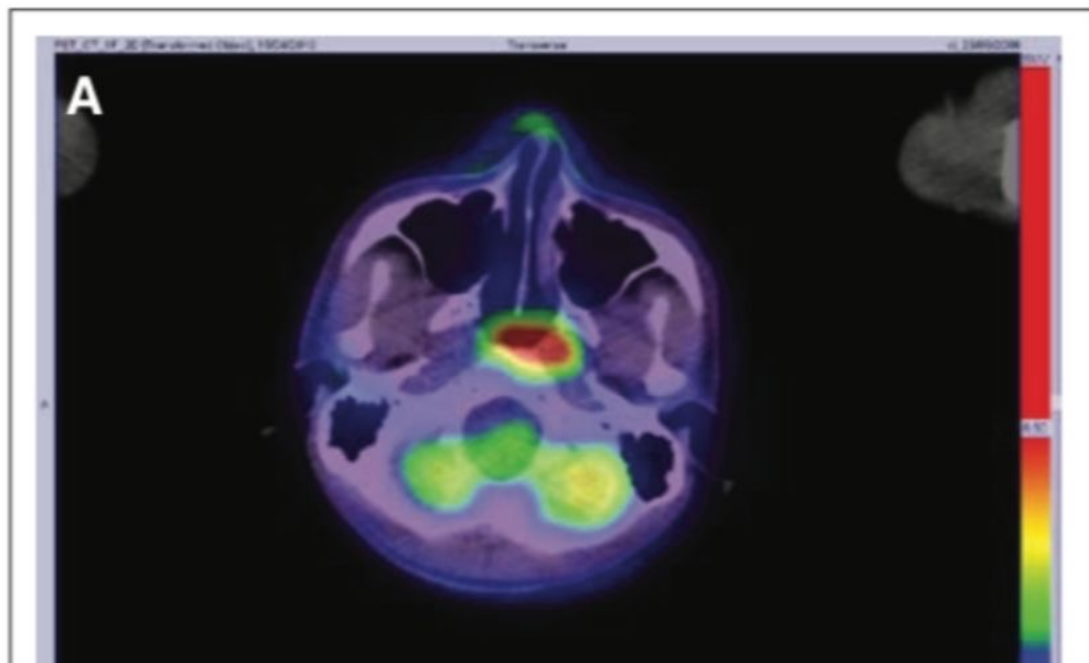

DIAGNOSIS IN ONCOLOGY

Prolonged Remission in a Patient With Nasopharyngeal Carcinoma With a Solitary Bone Metastasis

A 24-year-old man presented with a 2-month history of a painless left neck lump. Clinical examination revealed diffuse thickening of the left neck without a discernable mass and a single right-sided 1.5-cm jugulodigastric node, but no abnormalities elsewhere. Nasen-

tients when using conventional imaging.^{2,3} Platinum-based chemotherapy regimens are effective in previously untreated patients in both the neoadjuvant and metastatic/relapsed settings.⁴⁻⁹ The response rate for platinum-based combinations in the metastatic setting is approximately 40% to 70% with a median survival of 1 year. While locoregionally advanced NPC is frequently curable with an intensive course of chemoradiotherapy, the identification of distant metastases on staging investigations would generally deem a patient to be incurable and a more palliative approach would be adopted. 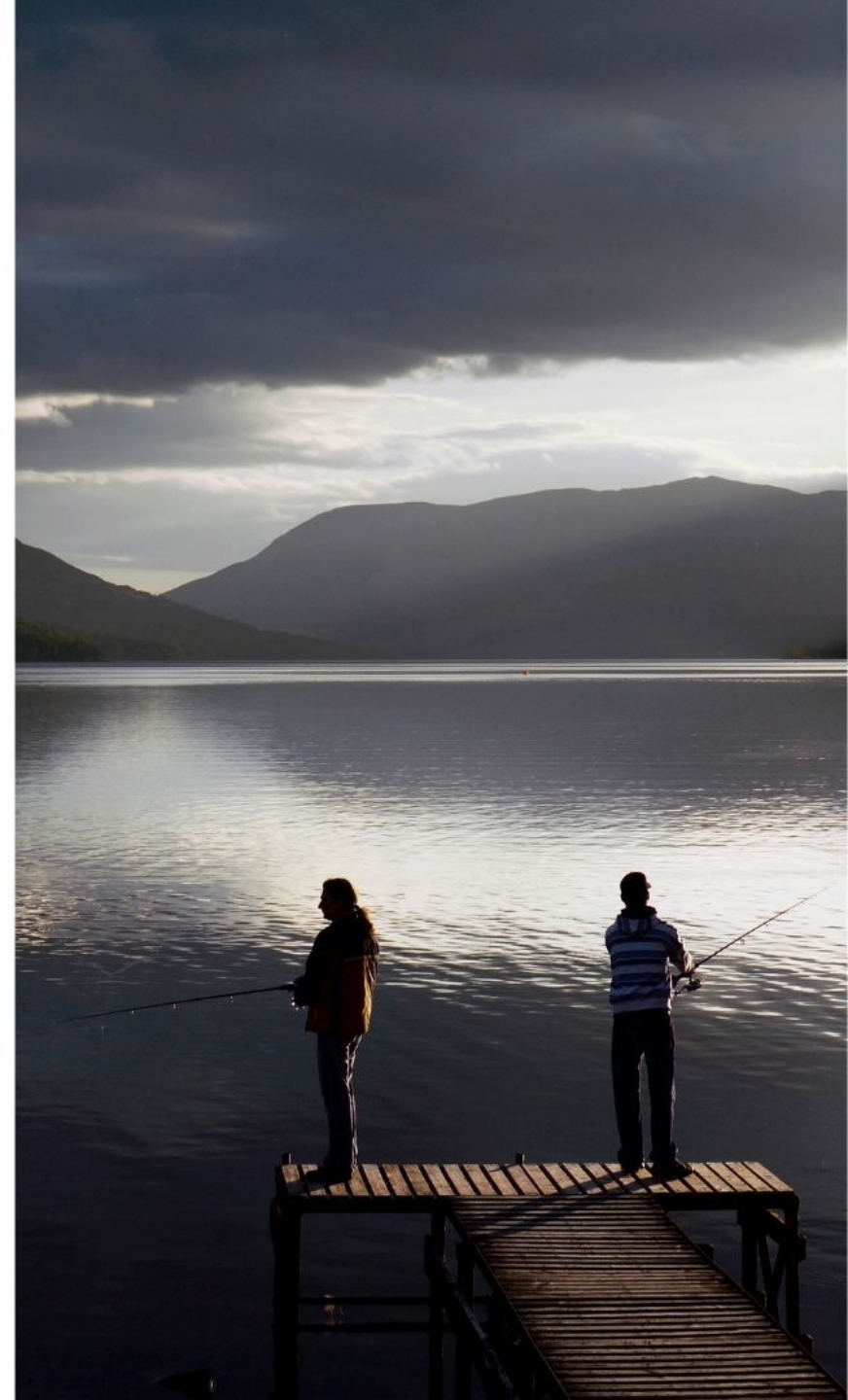

It's important to approach this situation with empathy and care. Here are a few suggestions on how to respond:



1. Validate her feelings: Acknowledge that her feelings are real and valid. Let her know that you understand why she might feel this way and that you're there to support her.
